Emmanuel Macron will be in Marseille for 3 days. The president will take stock of his "Marseille en Grand" plan launched almost 2 years ago. He is also expected to make announcements on housing, hospitals, schools and of course security. In an interview with La Provence, the Head of State has already announced that it will be possible to pay fines for possession or consumption of cannabis immediately, by credit card or in cash.

Court clerks are calling for a strike today to ask for an increase in the number of staff. Many demonstrations will take place today in several cities.

Mohamed Haouas will soon know his fate. The rugby player of the XV de France, sentenced for domestic violence last month, was assigned to the prud'hommes by ASM Clermont-Auvergne - Club to which he is committed for next season. The team of Auvergne has requested the suspension of his contract and the decision will be made today.

2 days after the attempted rebellion of the paramilitary group Wagner, there is still no trace of the leader of this militia Evguéni Prigojine. After having ordered his troops to retreat, he supposedly went to Belarus where he was to live in exile. The attempted rebellion against Putin's power shows "the divisions within the Russian camp", said Emmanuel Macron or even "cracks" according to the head of American diplomacy, Antony Blinken.

In Canada, the situation is getting worse day by day. More than 7 million hectares have gone up in smoke in just a few days after a series of fires. More than 200 fires are considered out of control. The smoke, coming from these fires has even crossed the Atlantic and should reach Europe this week. Heavy clouds will be visible today in France.

And then in Basketball, no World Cup for Victor Wembanyama. The new French star has decided not to participate in the next World Cup with *Les Bleus* - A way to preserve himself for his very first season in the NBA with the Spurs of San Antonio.
