A policeman has been taken into custody for manslaughter after he shot dead a young man at the wheel of a car yesterday in Nanterre. The officer opened fire after the 17-yearold refused to comply with his order to stop. The officer claims that had he not fired his gun, the driver would have run him over. However, a video filmed by a witness seems to contradict his version of events. Last night in Nanterre, a number of people denounced the boy's death and some clashes broke out with police. 20 people were arrested.

The Russian artist Piotr Pavlenski and his partner Alexandra de Taddéo will both be going on trial today for invasion of privacy after posting intimate videos of Benjamin Grivaud on the internet three years ago. The videos killed the political career of the former government spokesperson who had also been campaigning to be mayor of Paris.

Emmanuel Macron will be visiting the commercial port of Marseille at midday today on the third and final day of his visit to the city. Today, the president will be focusing on housing after spending the last couple of days discussing safety, schools and health.

In Ukraine, at least eight people have died and 40 more are injured after two Russian missiles hit a restaurant in the centre of Kramatorsk last night.
