After the death of Nahel, the public prosecutor's office requested the provisional detention of the police officer who fired the shot. According to the Nanterre public prosecutor's office, the legal conditions for the use of the weapon were not met at the time of the events. During his hearings, the policeman explained that he had fired to prevent the car from fleeing again. He and his colleague were supposedly afraid of being hit by the vehicle. The prosecutor also indicated that Nahel was known to the courts for refusing to comply. He was to be summoned in September before the juvenile court.

At the same time, new scenes of violence, in retaliation for the death of Nahel, erupted last night throughout France. Town halls were set on fire and vehicles burned. Some 150 people were arrested. The violence is described as "unacceptable" by Emmanuel Macron and Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin speaks of "intolerable violence against symbols of the Republic".

In this context, a solemn march is organized in Nanterre at 2 p.m., in front of the prefecture at the call of the teenager's mother. A moment of remembrance after 48 hours of tension.

Also in the news: a disappointment for *Familles Rurales*. For the consumer association, the anti-inflation quarter did not keep its promises. *Familles Rurales* noted a price increase of around 3% on a basket of so-called "healthy" products, recommended by health authorities. Whether it's bananas, rice or eggs. The association is asking the State to intervene.

And the strike is renewed at the Journal Du Dimanche. The editorial staff of the weekly is mobilized, to contest the nomination at its head of the former journalist of *Valeurs Actuelles* Geoffroy Lejeune. They fear a drift of the newspaper towards the extreme right. 97% of the voters expressed themselves in favor of the continuation of the strike. A new vote will take place tomorrow morning.

And then Waldemar Kita was placed in police custody yesterday. The president of the Nantes soccer club was heard by the judicial police in a dubious transfer case. A few hours later the boss of the Canaries was released.
