They were more than 6,000 in Nanterre. The solemn march in tribute to Nahel started calmly at the beginning of the afternoon, 2 days after the death of the 17-year-old teenager following a police shooting. Clashes erupted on arrival in front of the prefecture between some participants and the police.

Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin ensures that the State's response will be extremely firm and that from this evening, public order will be restored. In Ile-de-France, bus and tram traffic will be interrupted at from 9 p.m.

At the same time, the investigation continues. The police officer in question was indicted this evening for intentional homicide and placed in pre-trial detention. The Nanterre prosecutor gave an update on the case this afternoon. According to the investigation, and in particular thanks to the analysis of the videos, the court considers that the legal conditions for the use of the weapon were not met.

Also in the news, life in prison was confirmed for Jean-Marc Reiser during his appeal trial. The accused admitted to having killed Sophie Le Tan five years ago in le Bas-Rhin - An act which he explains by an "access of fury". The body of the 20-year-old student was found dismembered in a forest.

And then in soccer, a former world champion arrives at the PSG. Lucas Hernandez will join the Parisian club. The defender leaves Bayern Munich. His transfer is estimated at 40 million euros. The Frenchman will pass his medical examination tomorrow.
