Elisabeth Borne denounces a night of inexcusable violence. The Prime Minister is currently at the police station of Evry, after the third night of riots that France has just experienced following the death of Nahel. Elisabeth Borne assures that measures will be taken against this outbreak of violence. Last night, more than 600 people were arrested and 249 police officers and gendarmes injured. At the beginning of the afternoon Emmanuel Macron will chair a new inter-ministerial crisis unit. He left the European summit in Brussels.

After these acts of violence, the region of Ile-de-France will release 20 million euros, as announced by its president Valérie Pécresse. The budget will be voted on next Wednesday. It will be used to rebuild public facilities destroyed or damaged by the riots. Valérie Pécresse denounces "intolerable" acts aimed at "public services which the inhabitants need".

Christophe Galtier and his son are placed in police custody. The coach of the PSG is heard by the police in relation to the case of alleged racist remarks in Nice, two years ago. It is Julien Fournier, the former sports director of the club of Nice who accuses the coach of discrimination.

18 months in prison including 9 of actual prison time for Mohamed Haouas. The French rugby player has just been sentenced for aggravated violence for a fight that occurred in 2014. This new conviction of the former player of Montpellier is added to a one-year prison sentence he received last month for domestic violence.

This is a first in a year: Inflation is back below 5% in France at 4.5% this month. For the second month in a row, the rise in prices has slowed down, according to the INSEE. A trend explained by the lower rise in food prices. And energy prices have fallen by 3% over one year.

And then there will be traffic on the roads today: Île-de-France is red for departures. The rest of France is orange. No problems, on the other hand, for returns.
