Tradespeople who were victims of the recent rioting nationwide will receive compensation from the disaster fund. This aid is normally reserved for natural disasters. The announcement came yesterday from the Chambers of Trades and Crafts national organisation. It is unclear how many tradespeople will be able to request the payout of 1,500 euros.

The préfecture of police has banned all marches in memory of Adama Traore in the Val d'Oise tomorrow. The march had been organised by the family of the young man who died during a police arrest seven years ago. The annual march has always taken place without any violence, but this year the authorities fear for unrest after the recent police shooting of Nahel M in Nanterre.

"A fiasco", this is how the Senate inquiry committee described the Marianne fund managed by Secretary of State Marlène Schiappa. The fund had originally been launched after the death of teacher Samuel Paty and was meant to combat separatism. However, in their report, senators pointed to a lack of rigor, opacity and casualness in the management of the fund.
