Two weeks after the riots, the executive wants to avoid violence during the July 14 festivities. Measures were detailed today. 130,000 police and gendarmes will be mobilized, including the GIGN and the Raid. The use of fireworks will be prohibited, as will demonstrations. The Minister of the Interior also asks the prefects to stop public transportation at 10 p.m. in large urban areas except for metros and RERs. The objective for Gérald Darmanin is to prevent incidents.

Several people have been arrested in relation to the attack of the home of the mayor of l'Haÿ les Roses. At the time, the wife of the elected official and their two children had to flee and were hospitalized.

After months of tensions linked to the pension reform, unions and employers met today with the Prime Minister to define a social agenda. "We are getting back on track," said Sophie Binet, who is at the head of the CGT. As for the CFDT, it welcomed a "useful" meeting. Its secretary general Marylise Léon confirms new negotiations are planned at the start of the school year, in particular regarding professional retraining and arduous work.

Volodymyr Zelensky salutes a "victory" for Ukraine's security. During the NATO summit in Lithuania, the G7 announced it was committed to "long-term" military support for Ukraine as well as "rapid" aid in the event of a new war started by Moscow.

And then the Tour de France and the 11th stage today between Clermont-Ferrand and Moulins. Victory in the sprint for the Belgian cyclist Yaspère Philipssen; his fourth victory on this Tour.
