130,000 police and gendarmes will be deployed throughout the country this weekend as Gérald Darmanin is tightening security throughout the July 14<sup>th</sup> celebrations. 45,000 police forces will be mobilized for the next three evenings to counter any urban violence. The Minister of the Interior has asked prefectures to ban the sale of fireworks mortars. Buses and trams will also be stopping this evening at 10 p.m.

The IGPN, the police of the police, have been referred the Youssouf Traoré case. He says he was the victim of police violence during his arrest last week during a demonstration in tribute to his brother Adama. Adama Traoré was 24 years old when he died in police custody in 2016. His brother, Youssouf Traoré, was placed in custody last weekend as he was accused of dealing a blow to a police commissioner.

There is still no sign of little Emile, the 2-and-a-half-year-old boy who has been missing since Saturday. Yesterday, the new searches carried out at Vernet in the Alpes-de-Haute-Provence, did not find anything. The judicial investigation continues.

The Delon family were questioned yesterday within the framework of two complaints that have been filed against the actor's partner. Alain Delon's children have accused Hiromi Rollin of moral harassment, violence, and more generally of abusing the 87-year-old comedian since his stroke in 2019. A preliminary investigation was opened last week.

And finally to cycling and today is the 12<sup>th</sup> stage of the Tour de France. The riders will tackle the 169 km that lie between Roanne and Belleville-en-Beaujolais. Yesterday, Jasper Philipsen won at Moulins, a fourth stage win for the Belgian rider on this Grande Boucle. Jonas Vingergaard remains in the yellow jersey, a whole 17 seconds ahead of Tadej Pogacar.
