130,000 policemen and gendarmes will be mobilized throughout France for the festivities of July 14th. The Ministry of the Interior is putting in place the same measures as during the riots, as traditionally, the celebrations of July fourteenth result in incidents and misbehaviors.

Among the measures put in place this evening, is a change in public transportation hours: Buses and trams will stop circulating at 10 p.m. in all major urban areas. And it is also forbidden to demonstrate until Saturday.

The last search took place this morning at Vernet in the Alpes de Haute Provence to try to find Emile, the two-and-a-half-year-old little boy who has been missing since Saturday. The hearings continue as well as the analysis of the elements collected these past days. All the hypotheses continue to be studied.

The military programming bill is submitted today to the final vote of the Senate. This bill provides for 413 billion euros over seven years and measures to modernize the Armed Forces. The oppositions, in particular on the left, criticize the "announcement effects", stressing that around thirty billion euros will cover inflation.

And inflation has slightly decreased over one year to 4.5% according to the INSEE, partly thanks to the drop in energy prices. However, food prices continued to soar. According to Bercy, 39 manufacturers have pledged to make an effort by lowering the price of some of their products between July and September.
