The first fireworks are expected this evening for the celebrations of July 14. Authorities fear incidents, a few days after the riots which followed the death of Nahel. 130,000 members of the police force are mobilized, including the GIGN and the RAID. "If some want to spoil the party, justice will be there," says Éric Dupond-Moretti. The Minister of Justice asks the magistrates for a "rapid, systematic and firm response".

The Indian Prime Minister Narendra Modi is the guest of honor for this national holiday, as he is visiting Paris for two days. His trip is expected to result in the purchase of 26 new Rafale for the Indian navy, as well as submarines. But the visit of the Indian Prime Minister arouses anger of opponents who denounce human rights violations in India. A protest rally is being held at Place du Trocadéro in Paris.

The last search operation is over, at Vernet in the Alpes de Haute Provence after the disappearance of Emile. The gendarmes examined a section of road already searched during the first days of research. Investigators hoped to find new clues.

An eventful trip took place onboard a TGV Milan-Paris. The train had to stop at Le Creusot station in Saône et Loire because of an aggressive man. The man, in his thirties, had a knife and fought with an undercover policeman on board the train. According to a witness, he seized the officer's pistol and fired at least one shot. There were no injuries, and the man was arrested. A psychological unit has been set up.
