3 additional departments are placed under alert for heatwave tomorrow: Hérault, Gard and Bouche du Rhône join the 7 departments which remain under on orange alert by Météo France. Between 35 and 39 degrees are to be expected. Today, 40 degrees have been exceeded in the Pyrénées Orientales, the Var and in Corsica. Tonight, temperatures will only slightly decrease and possibly stabilize at 25 degrees on the coastline of the Alpes Maritimes.

More means and 2 investigating judges from Aix en Provence are seized in relation to the disappearance of the little Emile. The investigation now takes the form of a judicial investigation, which was opened today. This was announced by the prosecutor of Digne-les-Bains. In a press release, he indicates that "all possibilities remain considered, none being neither excluded nor privileged". The young boy has not been found since July 8, when he was with his grandparents in the Alpes de Haute Provence.

And the strike is renewed at the *Journal Du Dimanche* this morning, for the 26th day of mobilization of the editorial staff who are contesting the arrival of Geoffroy Lejeune at the head of the weekly newspaper. The journalists are still asking the management to cancel this nomination. And it is within this context that a bill will be submitted tomorrow in the National Assembly: carried out by about fifteen MPs, it aims to guarantee the independence of the media.

Finally, a small revolution in sight a few days before the start of the Women's soccer World Cup. In the event of the use of VAR, video assistance for arbitration, explanations will be broadcast live in stadiums and on television. The FIFA wishes to give, I quote "more transparency and a better understanding of referee decisions". The World Cup starts this Thursday in Australia and New Zealand.
