There is movement within government and as expected, several ministers are leaving. Gabriel Attal replaces Pap Ndiaye at the Ministry of National Education. Aurélien Rousseau, former director of the cabinet of Elisabeth Borne, becomes Minister of Health, replacing François Braun. The president of the group Renaissance in the National Assembly, Aurore Bergé, replaces Jean-Christophe Combe at the head of the Ministry of Solidarity. Marlène Schiappa is no longer secretary of State in charge of the Social and Solidarity Economy. And the Mayor of Dunkirk Patrice Vergriete arrives at the Ministry of Housing, replacing Olivier Klein. The First Council of Ministers of this new Borne government will take place tomorrow morning.

The provisional detention required of the four police officers of Marseille suspected of gang assault has been extended. They were transferred after 48 hours of police custody. The policemen are suspected of having beaten a 21-year-old man during the riots at the beginning of the month. They supposedly used their flash-ball at short distance. Four other police officers were released.

The repression of fraud is looking into school supplies. Authorities will investigate to verify that professionals are not taking advantage of the climate of inflation to inflate prices a few weeks before the start of the school year. Promotional offers will also be investigated. Large distribution professionals announced at the beginning of the month that the prices of school supplies will increase by 2 to 3%.

And the 18th stage of the Tour de France is taking place this afternoon, with 185 kilometers between Moûtiers and Bourg-en-Bresse - The opportunity for the peloton to catch its breath the day after a grueling mountain stage. Today's stage is rather at the advantage of sprinters. Jonas Vingegaard is still in yellow and unless a plot twist, the Dane should win his second consecutive Tour de France on Sunday.

And then there are only four departments left under orange heatwave alert: The Var, Alpes-Maritimes and the two Corsican departments, with temperatures often exceeding 35 degrees. Météo France calls for caution.
