The largest evacuation to have ever been carried out in Greece has been underway over the weekend. 30,000 people had to leave their homes on the island of Rhodes due to wildfires. 250 firefighters, 10 planes and 8 helicopters have been deployed to fight the flames which are still raging. Yesterday, temperatures hit higher than 46° in south-west Greece.

A judicial investigation has been opened for attempted pre-meditated murder after the ram raid attack on the home of the Mayor of Hay-les-Roses. The announcement comes from the public prosecutor's office in Créteil after 12 people were arrested for the attack in early July. These individuals could face charges of the destruction of other people's property by dangerous means by an organised group and conspiracy to prepare a serious offence. Two examining magistrates will handle the case.

The city of Marseille is launching an app today which women can use to report violence at the beach. The app is called Safer Plage and will allow anyone to report an attack. The app comes as more than a third of women between the ages of 18 and 34 have said they have been victims of harassment at the beach. When a report is made via the app, a team of specialized mediators will be immediately alerted and can intervene.

In football, the group stages continue in the 2023 Women's World Cup. The lineup this Monday will see Italy play Argentina, Germany play Morocco and Brazil play Panama. Yesterday France played their first match and drew 0-0 against Jamaica. The next match for France is on Saturday against Brazil.

And finally, the animated series Futurama is back on Disney+ today after a 10-year hiatus. The series that told the story of a New York pizza delivery boy who time travelled to the future started in 1999.
