The month of July is on the way to becoming the hottest month ever recorded on Earth, according to the European Copernicus Institute. The world has experienced high peaks in temperature, with more than 52 degrees in China and 49 at night in the Death Valley in California. According to Copernicus, global warming and the impact of the El Niño phenomenon are at the origin of these temperatures. And El Niño will continue to raise temperatures in the coming months.

Meanwhile, hundreds of firefighters continue to fight the fires in Greece, in particular on the islands of Rhodes, Corfu and Euboea, as wind is blowing hard today. In two weeks, 600 forest fires have broken out in the country. The flames have caused record levels of carbon emissions - The highest in the last two decades for a month of July.

Gérald Darmanin will meet the police unions this evening. The Minister of the Interior wants to start the dialogue as many agents are working minimum service throughout France. They are protesting the placement in pre-trial detention of one of their colleagues from Marseille, suspected of violence against a 21-year-old young man during the riots earlier this month.

And a new system to allow children to go on vacation. The Minister of Solidarity Aurore Bergé announces the creation of a "camp pass" - A boost of 200 to 350 euros per child. This concerns families receiving a maximum of 4,000 euros. This pass will help 80% of children go to summer camp via the CAF, from 2024.

And then Léon Marchand continues to dominate the world swimming championships. The Frenchman won a third gold medal this afternoon, in the 200-meter medley. With a total of 5 world victories, he becomes the most successful Frenchman at the World individual championships, ahead of Camille Lacourt. A little earlier, Maxime Grousset won the bronze in the 100-meter freestyle.
