An investigation is opened in the Yvelines after the death of a 16-year-old teenager last night. The young man, on a motorcycle, was hit by the police in Élancourt. He did not survive his injuries. The collision apparently took place after a refusal to comply. The agents chased him while he fled. The Versailles public prosecutor's office opened two investigations, including one for refusal to comply.

Brigitte Macron is expected this afternoon in Poissy, in the Yvelines at the home of the teenager who committed suicide Tuesday evening. The 15-year-old young man had reported acts of school harassment. The minister of Education Gabriel Attal announced the opening of an administrative investigation to shed light on the harassment suffered by the victim.

Bruno Le Mair launched an appeal to TotalEnergies. The Minister of the Economy asks the company to continue capping fuel prices beyond December 31 at 1 euro 99 for diesel and gasoline, as the symbolic 2 euros per liter has been crossed in several large cities. Bruno Le Mair continues to oppose a new rebate from the government.

More than 24 million French people took the train this summer. This is an absolute record attendance, according to the Minister of Transport. Clément Beaune explains these good figures by the number of main line trains put into service, which is more than 800.

After the death of General Georgelin, his right-hand man, Philippe Jost, was appointed head of the Notre-Dame-de-Paris reconstruction project.
