14 departments are placed under orange heatwave alert for tomorrow. All the departments of the Centre-Val de Loire and Île-de-France regions are concerned. Tomorrow afternoon even higher temperatures are expected. The thermometer will show between 32 and 36 degrees, with even peaks at 37 locally. The phenomenon could continue for several more days. According to Météo France, global warming favors the extension of such episodes beyond the summer period.

What happened in the Yvelines last night? Two investigations are open after the death of a 16-year-old teenager, in Elancourt, fatally hit by a police car, as he was riding a motorcycle. According to the police, a refusal to comply is at the origin of the tragedy. The CRS 8, a police unit specialized in urban violence, is deployed this afternoon in Elancourt. The family of the victim announces that they are filing a complaint for attempted voluntary homicide.

And Brigitte Macron is in Poissy, in the Yvelines, to meet with the parents of the 15-year-old teenager who committed suicide on Tuesday evening. The teenager was the victim of school harassment. According to the Minister of National Education Gabriel Attal, the young man had reported, at the end of 2022, repeated bullying and insults from several students. Two investigations are open, one judicial and one administrative. The parents have not yet been heard.

What if you visited the Elysée? On the occasion of the Heritage Days you will have the opportunity to stroll through the presidential palace. But for that you have to register: An online ticket office will open today at 6 p.m. Heritage Days will be held on September 16 and 17.

As for soccer, les Bleus are back on the fields. The French team faces Ireland tonight in a qualifying match for the Euro of 2024. Kick-off at 8:45 p.m.

And then tomorrow begins the Rugby World Cup. On the eve of the clash against New Zealand, the French team began training more than an hour late today at the Stade de France. Their lateness was due to traffic conditions according to the French Rugby Federation. For the police headquarters, responsible for escorting the team, les Bleus were simply late.
