Searches continue in Morocco, 3 days after the earthquake which killed more than 2,100 people and injured 2,400 more. Emergency services are still searching the rubble in hope of finding survivors. Moroccan authorities announced yesterday that they had accepted the aid from 4 countries: Spain, Great Britain, Qatar and the United Arab Emirates. Although the help of France was not accepted, the NGO International Emergency Firefighters stands ready to intervene and respects the country's decision.

Foreign Minister Catherine Colonna announced 5 million euros of aid for NGOs present in Morocco.

In the rest of the news, another shooting took place in Marseille last night in the district of Saint-Thys in the 10th arrondissement. A woman was seriously injured. She was hit by a Kalashnikov bullet which went through a wall. A man was also injured. According to the first elements, 2 individuals on scooters entered the district before firing in bursts at a deal point. They then fled.

3 weeks after the start of the controversy, Luis Rubiales announces his resignation. The president of the Spanish soccer federation will leave his post. He was suspended by the FIFA after his forced kiss on a Spanish player at the final of the Women's World Cup. The Spanish prosecutor's office also requested his indictment for sexual assault.

And then the quarter-finals of the men's volleyball tournament: The French team faces Romania this evening - the only team to have beaten les Bleus so far in the competition. The match begins at 8pm.
