In an interview with l'Humanité, the communist Fabien Roussel demands measures from the State against the increase in prices, particularly those of food and energy. Even if it means invading the prefectures, if necessary. The MP sees it as a question of self-defense.

The race against time continues in Bordeaux after the death of a 32-year-old young woman from botulism, as other people may potentially be sick. They all ate sardines in a restaurant in the city from a contaminated jar. At this stage, 12 cases of botulism have been identified in France these past days while around thirty are usually recorded each year.

An investigation has been opened in Marseille after the attack on a Jewish student. The 21-year-old young man was heading towards the synagogue on Saturday when he was attacked and assaulted. He was supposedly targeted by anti-Semitic insults. The Representative Council of Jewish Institutions of France, in Marseille, strongly condemns this attack.

The state of emergency is declared in Italy, on the island of Lampedusa, after the arrival of more than 6,000 migrants, while the capacity of the registration camp is limited at 400 places. A five-month-old child died after falling into the water. The Italian government assures that it will do everything necessary to help the inhabitants of Lampedusa and the migrants who continue to arrive on the island. As for, Gérald Darmanin, he announced reinforcements at the Italian border.

And Vladimir Putin accepts Kim Jong-un's invitation to visit North Korea. The North Korean leader has just visited Russia in order to strengthen ties between Moscow and Pyongyang, particularly military ties. For the moment, nothing has been officially communicated on a possible agreement for deliveries of military equipment to Russia to support its offensive in Ukraine.
