Two men are being tried from today before the Circuit Court of Pau. They are accused of having assaulted a bus driver in Bayonne a little over three years ago. The altercation had started because they had no tickets and were not wearing masks. The 59-year-old driver, in a state of brain death after his attack, died five days later. The two accused risk up to thirty years in prison.

An investigation has been opened in Finistère after the death of an 11-year-old girl at the Brest University Hospital. The tragedy occurred at the beginning of August during an operation for scoliosis. Her death is supposedly due to the Intubation. Additional medical expertise is requested.

In Morocco, almost a week after the earthquake which killed almost 3,000 people, a rehousing program will be put in place. More than 50,000 buildings have been damaged. The Moroccans concerned will be temporarily rehoused in structures designed to withstand the cold and bad weather. The Moroccan state will also release emergency aid of more than 2,700 euros for households affected by the disaster.

And it's a promising process: A pig's kidney transplanted into a man worked for two months, which is a record. The director of the Transplant Institute at a New York hospital says he is optimistic for the future. These animal organ transplants into humans could offer a solution to the shortage of kidney donations.

And to finish: Apple will update its iPhone 12 to comply with European rules. French authorities had withdrawn the model from the market because of the level of wave emission of the device, which was considered too high. Finally, Apple will carry out an update in the coming days to return to correct levels.
