The king is coming to Paris! Charles III is expected early this afternoon at the Orly airport. Accompanied by his wife Camilla, he will be welcomed by Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne. His visit will then last three days. Charles III will head to the Arc de Triomphe where he will rekindle the flame of the unknown soldier in the company of Emmanuel Macron. This evening, a dinner will be organized at the Château de Versailles and on Friday the British sovereign will go to Bordeaux.

No sales at a loss for fuel in Carrefour stores. This is what the company's CEO Alexandre Bompard announced during a hearing before the Economic Affairs Committee of the Assembly. Yesterday, the large fuel distributors were received at the Ministry of the Economy. And they are clearly not excited by the measure.

A new measure to avoid waste will soon to go into in force in pharmacies. Certain antibiotics will be sold individually to avoid shortages. Pharmacists will have to deliver them pill by pill, when provided a prescription, instead of selling the whole box.

And this is a first since the start of the war in Ukraine: Volodymyr Zelensky will speak before the UN Security Council today. The Ukrainian president will face Russia, a permanent member of the body. It is the Minister of Foreign Affairs, Sergei Lavrov, who will represent Moscow. Meanwhile, on the ground, the fighting continues. Ukraine announces having shot down 17 Russian drones last night.

Tensions are still high in Azerbaijan. A military operation killed at least 19 people and injured 200 more in Nagorno-Karabakh yesterday. This Armenian enclave has been the scene of a conflict for thirty years. Local authorities have called for an immediate ceasefire, but Azerbaijan demands a "total and unconditional" surrender and calls on separatist forces to lay down their arms.

And then soccer with the first day of the Champions League. After PSG's victory last night against Dortmund, Lens is playing this evening on the field of Seville. The Lensois, last in Premier league, want to get back on track in Europe. Kick-off at 9 p.m.
