Pope Francis landed this afternoon in Marseille, where he begins a two-day visit of France - more precisely of Marseille - as part of the Mediterranean Meetings. The sovereign pontiff will meet tomorrow the French Head of State Emmanuel Macron.

Emmanuel Macron will also attend the mass that the Pope will give in the Vélodrome in front of nearly 60,000 people tomorrow evening.

And they are finishing their trip to France this evening: Charles III and Camilla are about to return to the United Kingdom, after spending their last day in Bordeaux. They met the mayor of the city and greeted the crowd. Thousands of people had come. For this last day in France, they are visiting an experimental forest and will tour an organic wine estate.

Also in the news: A man was shot dead last night in Toulouse. The shooting occurred in Empalot, a sensitive area of the city. The victim was targeted near a deal point and did not survive his injuries. According to several witnesses, the shooter fled by foot.

The supporters will have to wait. It is still too early to say the duration of Antoine Dupont's unavailability. The captain of the XV de France was the victim of a very violent shock to the face last night during the match against Namibia. He suffers from a "fracture below the cheekbone". The diagnosis will be refined in the coming days.
