The first 3 days of searches were unsuccessful, but a new search has begun in the Bas Rhin to try to find Lina. The 15-year-old girl disappeared on Saturday when she was supposed to join her boyfriend in Strasbourg. Residents and soldiers will concentrate on an area of only a few kilometers, between Lina's home and the neighboring train station of Antoine Ayvassian. An investigation has been opened for the concerning disappearance. More than 200 volunteers are mobilized today to try to find the young girl.

Also in the news: How can the price of fuels be lowered? This has been the government's objective for several weeks. After the failure of the idea of selling at a loss, the executive is now asking distributors to sell gasoline and diesel at cost price. The subject will also be at the heart of a meeting this evening in Matignon between Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne and professionals in the sector.

This is a figure that has been falling for ten years: Less than one in two French women aged 50 to 74 were screened for breast cancer last year. This is the result of an OpinionWay survey for the League against cancer. It is published a few days before the launch of Pink October - the national awareness campaign begins on Sunday.

Railroad traffic is somewhat disrupted, mainly in the Paris region, but overall traffic is almost normal at the SNCF today despite the call for a strike by 3 unions. They denounce the dismantling of the company and social damage.
