Politicians want to resolve the "Bedbug situation". These insects were found these past weeks in schools, movie theaters and public transportation. Minister Clément Beaune will also receive transport operators tomorrow morning, such as the SNCF and the RATP to discuss the issue. Today, the leader of the *Insoumis* in the Assembly Mathilde Panot calls on the government to act against the proliferation of these parasites. In response, Prime Minister Elisabeth Borne recalled the commitment of the executive to this phenomenon.
