Bedbugs will be the central subject of a conseil ministériel held today at the Prime Minister's offices at Matignon. The main challenge is to find a way to wipe out the insect. Transport Minister Clément Beaune has tried to reassure the public about bed bugs after several cases of bugs being spotted on seats have been reported on public transport.

Today is National Carers' day for people who take care of an elderly or disabled loved one on a daily basis. Announcements to make carer lives easier are expected today, including a one-stop shop to facilitate administrative procedures and better support.

Another suspicious death has been reported at Remiremont hospital in the Vosges. Surgery at the hospital has been suspended after another patient died on Tuesday. The hospital has received twelve complaints filed by patients' families in recent months.

51 people were killed, including a 6-year-old child, in an attack from Russia on the village of Groza in Ukraine yesterday. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky called it "a brutal terrorist attack" and called for a "just" and "powerful" response.

And finally, France is just one match away from the quarter-finals of the Rugby World Cup! Les Bleus play Italy in the last of their group matches tonight. If France wins, then they take the lead of the group. That match gets underway at 9pm. For now, that first place is held by New Zealand. The All Blacks crushed Uruguay last night, with a final score of 73-0.
