123,000 people are displaced in the Gaza Strip after the response of the Israeli army. The UN announced this this morning after the clashes that have occurred since this weekend in the Middle East. More than 1,100 people are reported dead; 700 Israelis including one French national and 400 in the Gaza Strip. The attack of the Hamas was largely condemned by the members of the UN Security Council. French Foreign Minister Catherine Colonna says France is taking action to avoid a further deterioration of the situation.

Representatives of the Jewish institutions are received today by Gérald Darmanin. The Minister of the Interior will meet with the Chief Rabbi of France, the president of the CRID and that of the central consistory. They will discuss the situation after the Hamas' surprise offensive against Israel. This weekend, Gérald Darmanin asked the prefects to strengthen the security of Israeli community places.

In this context, several gatherings are organized this evening in support of the populations under attack. This is particularly the case in Paris in the 17th arrondissement of the capital Place d'Israel. A gathering is scheduled at 6:30 p.m. at the call of the representative council of the Jewish institutions in France.

In the rest of the news: good news for retirees who receive small pensions. From today, these are revalued. They will be entitled to an additional 100 euros max. This increase will depend on the number of quarters contributed. It was a promise from the government as part of the pension reform. The objective is to increase the minimum pensions to 1,200 euros for all full careers.

Today we will know if Antoine Dupont will be able to play in the quarter-final of the World Cup against South Africa on Sunday. The scrum half is meeting in Toulouse for talks with the doctor who performed his surgery.

And then the ticket office for the Paralympic Games opened this morning. You can buy your tickets on the same platform as for the Olympic Games. In total, 2.8 million places are available. Prices range from 15 to 100 euros. Opening and closing ceremonies not included.
