The football match between Lyon and Marseille on day 10 of the League 1 had to be postponed last night after Marseille supporters threw stones at the Lyon bus before it arrived at the Velodrome stadium. A projectile even hit and injured Fabio Grosso, the Lyon coach. Lyon is due to file a complaint. Sports Minister Amélie Oudéa-Castera has called the images from yesterday “absolutely revolting”.

The situation in Gaza is increasingly desperate as residents there have run out of water, food and medical equipment. The UN confirmed that 33 aid trucks had been able to enter the Gaza strip yesterday, as residents flooded to the south in order to avoid Israeli bombing. The Prosecutor of the International Criminal Court has issued a reminder to Israel that preventing civilian populations access to humanitarian aid constitutes a crime.

In Val d'Oise yesterday afternoon, a gendarme killed his three daughters before taking his own life. The crime took place at his home in Vémar. The bodies were found by one of the man's colleagues. The mother of the three girls is being taken care of by the emergency services. An investigation has been opened by the Versailles investigative unit.

And finally, Emmanuel Macron is expected in Villers-Cotterêts today. The President will inaugurate the Cité internationale de la langue française, a space dedicated to the French language, its history, its developments and its international influence.
