A major police operation took place this morning in Paris. The police opened fire on a woman who, according to them, was advocating terrorism. She was seriously injured. This happened inside the station Bibliothèque François Mitterrand. We do not have any further information for the time being.

Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu said yesterday that there will be no ceasefire in the Gaza Strip. According to him, this will amount to giving in to the barbarity of Hamas. The Israeli army continues its bombings in the Palestinian enclave but also its land offensive on site. The IDF announced that it has entered several areas located north of the Gaza Strip, with a deployment of several battle tanks and armored vehicles.

Gerald Darmanin asks the prefects and the police to be especially vigilant this evening for the festivities of Halloween. Last year, numerous incidents were reported, cars were burned, and police officers and firefighters attacked. Some prefectures have already banned the retail sale of fireworks and fuel.

In the rest of the news, inflation is slowing down significantly in France. According to the INSEE, the price rise is at 4% over one year in October, while it was at 4.9% in September. The Minister of the Economy believes that France is in the process of "emerging from the inflationary crisis".

And the storm is approaching. From tomorrow, rain and strong gusts of wind exceeding 100 km/h inland are expected in the West and more particularly in Brittany. Météo France has also placed for tomorrow, Côtes-d'Armor, Finistère and Morbihan under orange alert for strong winds. Today, only Haute-Corse is affected by this alert.

And then in tennis: Entry into the running today of Gael Monfils, Ugo Humbert and Arthur Fils at the Rolex Paris Masters. This evening the favorites, Carlos Alcaraz and Andrey Rublev, will be playing.
