Two people have died in Storm Ciaran, a fifty-year-old truck driver was killed when a tree fell on his truck and a man in his seventies fell to his death after being knocked by one of the shutters at his home. Trees have been uprooted and the roofs of buildings blown away. Insurance companies say the damage will be expensive, between 270 and 480 million euros. Last night, nearly 700,000 homes were still without electricity and for many their mobile phone network was not working.

Today, in Hauts-de-France, TER train services remain disrupted, and while 5 départements remain on amber weather alert, storm Ciaran is moving away from France. Six people have lost their lives in other European countries due to Ciaran. Now, storm Domingos is also due to hit France's Atlantic coast.

France is sending a second helicopter carrier carrying hospital beds to off the coast of Gaza, to model the French military ship "Tonnere".

One of the leading figures in cryptocurrency, Sam Bankman Fried, has been found guilty of all charges brought against him, including fraud, criminal conspiracy and money laundering.

And finally, today is the quarter-finals at the Masters tournament at the Accor Arena in Paris Bercy.
