Only the Pas-de-Calais is left under orange alert for flood risks. In total, the damage from the storm is estimated at nearly 400 million euro. Thousands of insurance claims have already been filed. Moreover, given the power of the weather phenomenon, the declaration period has been extended until December 1st, while usually it is only a few days.

And Emmanuel Macron is in Finistère, in Plougastel-Daoulas. The head of state spoke with the rescue teams as well as with the victims following the storm. He promises to do everything to ensure that repairs are done as quickly as possible, with a qualification of natural and agricultural disaster. Furthermore, Emmanuel Macron aims to restore electricity to 90% of affected households by Monday. At midday there were still 450,000 homes without power.

Jean-Christophe Quenot is on trial from today in Paris. This French teacher based in Malaysia is accused of having raped dozens of children and teenagers in several Asian countries. Today he appears for acts involving 25 victims. The police seized 170,000 photos and videos depicting him in the company of minors. He faces up to 20 years in prison.

France demands explanations from Israel after the bombing of the French Institute in Gaza. The Quai d'Orsay requests, without delay, the elements which motivated this decision. No French agent or national was in the Institute at that time.

And Benjamin Netanyahu refuses a temporary truce in Gaza until the hostages held by Hamas are released. This request for a truce was made by the American Secretary of State, Antony Blinken as he visited Israel. In parallel, Hassan Nasrallah, the leader of the Lebanese Hezbollah, an ally of Hamas, accuses the United States of being responsible for the war in Gaza.

And then the European Judo Championships began today in Montpellier, with a first French medal this afternoon. Shirine Boukli was crowned European champion in under 48 kilos. It is her third European title.
