After numerous postponements, the Immigration Bill arrives this afternoon in the Senate. A text carried by the Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin which plans to expel "delinquent" foreigners as a priority and to regularize workers without papers in professions under tension. The bill will be examined from Monday 4 p.m. in the Senate.

Eric Dupont Moretti is before the Court of Justice of the Republic today. Not as a lawyer, but as a defendant. The Minister of Justice appears on suspicion of "illegal taking of interest". He is accused of having used his power in government to settle scores with magistrates.

And almost a month after the assassination of Professor Dominique Bernard in Arras, Elisabeth Borne wishes to take measures to address the terrorist threat in schools. The Prime Minister proposes call buttons in schools to notify the police in the event of danger.

126,000 homes are still without electricity this morning. Many homes in Brittany, Normandy and Nouvelle Aquitaine are still in the dark according to Enedis, as a consequence of the storms which hit the region these past days.

And then that's it. Since 11:25 a.m. this morning, all women have been working for free. This symbolic date aims to raise awareness about wage inequalities. This year, women earn on average 15.4% less than their male colleagues.
