The government wants to help the victims in Pas-de-Calais. Gérald Darmanin and Christophe Béchu arrived in Saint-Étienne-au-Mont this morning. The Ministers of the Interior and Ecological Transition came to see the damage after the passage of the storms. Today the floodwater is slowly starting to subside in Pas-de-Calais, even if the rivers remain under close surveillance.

One month after the start of the conflict between Israel and Hamas, and the increase in anti-Semitic acts in France, a major march against anti-Semitism will be organized this Sunday in Paris between the Senate and the National Assembly. The call was launched by the presidents of the two houses of Parliament, namely Gérard Larcher and Yaël Braun-Pivet. Jordan Bardella and Marine Le Pen of the Rassemblement National announced their participation - A presence denounced by the LFI and the Insoumis refuse to participate in this march.

This is the flagship and controversial article of the Immigration Bill: Article 3 on the regularization of illegal immigrant workers in professions under tension will be debated today in the Senate. Last night, the elected Republican officials and their centrist allies have reached an agreement to remove this measure.
