Emmanuel Macron salutes exemplary national solidarity. He declared this from Pas de Calais, a department affected by floods these past days. The President has also announced an emergency fund of 50 million euros for the affected local authorities. 244 municipalities including more than 200 in Pas de Calais will also be placed in a state of natural disaster from tomorrow.

The immigration bill has reached a new stage: It will be submitted to the Senate for a vote this afternoon. After several days of debate, the text has been largely reworked and is now stricter compared to the government's version. The bill will then be debated in the national assembly on December 11.

In the rest of the news, 1 person has died and 2 were seriously injured in a road accident that occurred after a police chase last night in Paris. The driver refused to stop, and the escapees' car crashed into a tree.

Also, a 3rd wave of sanctions from the United States against Hamas. They were decided in coordination with the United Kingdom against officials of the Palestinian armed movement and affiliated people, in particular an official of the Islamic Jihad. All their American assets were frozen.

And also abroad, Denmark will restrict the sale of alcohol to under 18-year-olds. It was until now authorized under certain conditions. According to the high national health authority 22% of young Danish girls aged 15 and 27% of young boys drink weekly. Moreover, 40% of young Danes have already been drunk in the last 30 days. As a reminder, in France the sale of alcohol is prohibited to minors.
