Storm Frederico continues to cross France. After Puy de Dôme, upper Corsica is now affected by an orange alert for violent winds. 4 other departments are still under orange alert for floods: Pas de Calais, northern Vendée and Charente Maritime.

In the rest of the news, this is the third time that they have been summoned by Emmanuel Macron to Saint Denis. The leaders of political parties are meeting at the Education House of the Legion of Honor today to talk about the referendums. The head of the *Republicains* Eric Ciotti, but also that of *France Insoumise* and of the Socialist Party have declined the invitation. The Greens, the Communists and the *Rassemblement National* will be present. The meetings are scheduled from 9:15 a.m.

Two Raid police officers are indicted for alleged violence in Marseille. The victim is a young man who lost an eye during the riots last summer. He said he was shot with an LBD. His cousin died the next day while riding a scooter. He was supposedly hit by at least one LBD shot. In this case, three Raid police officers are indicted and placed under judicial supervision.

They are called the diabolical lovers of Mirepoix: Marie-José Montesinosse and her lover Jean-Paul Vidal appear from today before the court of Ariège. They are accused of having killed in 2017 the woman's former partner, as well as his 18-year-old daughter, who was present during the ambush laid on her father.

Russia is accumulating missiles for attacks on Ukrainian infrastructure in winter, says Volodymyr Zelensky. The Ukrainian president also believes that the war between Israel and Hamas has slowed down the delivery of shells to Ukraine.

And today is match day for les Bleus: The French team is heading to Nice today where it will face Gibraltar tomorrow as part of the qualifications for Euro of 202'. A qualification already acquired for the men of Didier Deschamps who now want to secure the first place in the group.
