The hostages in the Gaza Strip will not be released until tomorrow. The agreement was due to come into force today but was postponed by 24 hours due to last minute discussions. The agreement also includes a 4-day truce. Humanitarian organizations hope to be able to send 400 aid trucks every day, compared to 1,000 in total over the last 4 weeks. But this will remain very insufficient compared to the needs on site according to Jean-François Corty, vice-president of Médecins du monde.

And Médecins du monde plans to send 6 tons of medical equipment during this 4-day truce. This includes equipment for surgery but also enough to meet the health needs of 20,000 people for 3 months.

Also in the news, restaurant vouchers can continue to be used for food shopping. The National Assembly has just extended the exemption until the end of 2024. It was due to end on December 31st. The text must now be voted by the Senate.

A major investment in the field of health in Chartres is expected to be announced today by Emmanuel Macron. The pharmaceutical giant Novo Nordisk will devote more than 2 billion euros to a project to extend the center of Eure et Loire. It is the world leader in care against diabetes and other chronic illnesses such as obesity and hemophilia.

And then there's soccer this evening, for the 2nd day of the women's Champions League. The PSG will receive the Bayern Munich at 6:45 p.m. and Paris FC will challenge Chelsea in England at 9 p.m.
