17 more hostages were released by Hamas yesterday on the third day of the truce in fighting between Israel and Gaza. No French hostages have been released yet and France is calling for the truce to be extended in order for further hostages to be released.

Three years after the assassination of Samuel Paty, six minors will be tried behind closed doors from today before the Paris children's court. Five of them are accused of naming the history-geography teacher to the assailant in exchange for money. A sixth teenager will be tried for slanderous denunciation. The trial will last until December 8th.

Tensions remain high in Romans-sur-Isère. Supporters of the extreme-right gathered once again yesterday following the death of Thomas, the 16-year-old who was killed a week ago when fighting broke out in Crépol in the Drôme. The public prosecutor of Valence has called for calm and is urging people to "not take justice into their own hands".

And finally the new Immigration Bill will be discussed today in a committee at the Assemblée Nationale. 17 members of parliament from the Républicains party say they are ready to vote on the text, on the condition that it remains close to the Senate version. Senators did approve the new bill but significantly tightened it, with the elimination of state medical aid for undocumented immigrants.
