The trial of Monique Olivier began this morning before the court of Hauts de Seine. Monique Olivier, the ex-wife of Michel Fourniret, is on trial for complicity in three murders, those of Estelle Mouzin, Johanna Parish and Marie Angèle Domèce. After the death of the serial killer in 2021, it is now alone that she appears. For Corinne Hermann, lawyer for the Domèce Family, Monique Olivier is not the submissive wife that some imagine, but indeed the accomplice of Michel Fourniret.

The personality of Monique Olivier will be at the heart of the debates this afternoon. Her trial will last 3 weeks.

Also in the news: Smoking will soon cost more. A pack of cigarettes will be sold for 12 euros in 2025 and 13 euros in 2026. This is one of the announcements to remember from the plan to fight smoking revealed at the end of the morning by the Minister of Health Aurélien Rousseau. Tobacco-free spaces will also be generalized to all beaches, public parks and around certain public places such as schools.

And it's of course a huge relief for the families of Sahar, Erez and Eitan. These 3 French children, detained by Hamas since October 7, were released yesterday evening. It was supposed to end yesterday, but the truce between Israel and Hamas has been extended for 2 more days and is due to end on Thursday.
