It's a relief for Éric Dupond-Moretti. The Minister of Justice was acquitted this afternoon by the Court. The Minister of Justice was tried for illegal conflict of interest. The Norwegian tree will be equipped with more than 50,000 multicolored LED lights and, at the top, a star covered with 3 million crystals. Its lights will illuminate the Big Apple until January 13.
