New hostages may be released in the Middle East. The truce between Hamas and Israel has been extended in the Gaza Strip. Israeli authorities indicate that they have received a new list of hostages to be released this Thursday.

And it is in this context that a fatal shooting took place in Jerusalem. Three people were killed, 13 others injured. According to Israeli emergency services, two men opened fire this morning, from a car near a bus stop. Two suspects were neutralized according to the police press release.

2 weeks of debates on climate change begin today, with the COP 28 in Dubai. Countries around the world will try to find solutions to limit global warming and emissions of CO2.

And the fall of 2023 "will be the hottest ever recorded since 1900". This is what the climate report for the year 2023 reveals. It was presented this morning at Météo-France headquarters in Toulouse by the Minister of Ecological Transition, Christophe Béchu.

In France, 4 departments are under orange alert: Haute Savoie, Savoie, Isère and Hautes Alpes for risk of rain and flooding. The alert will begin in the middle of the afternoon.

Also in the news: An ultra-right gathering is banned by the Paris police chief. A small group called for a demonstration tomorrow evening in the heart of Paris in tribute to Thomas, but Laurent Nunez fears incitement to hatred and violence.

And inflation is slowing in France. Prices increased by 3.4% in one year by November according to figures published this morning by INSEE, compared to just over 4% in October.
