After several days of truce, fighting resumed in Gaza between the Israeli army and Hamas. The Palestinian organization is accused of having violated the truce by firing rockets towards the Israeli territory. Despite the resumption of fighting, negotiations with the Qatari and Egyptian mediators continue. Last night, six Israeli hostages were released by Hamas.

The COP28 in Dubai is officially the largest climate conference ever organized, with 80,000 registered participants. Emmanuel Macron will spend two days on site. He will participate in meetings on the greening of maritime transportation, but also on forests and oceans. He will give a speech this evening. King Charles III is also on site today; he says he prays that this COP will be a decisive turning point in reducing emissions.

How can 35,000 new student accommodations be built by 2027? This is the question that the Minister of Higher Education and Housing must answer today. He is currently visiting an office building transformed into a student residence in Suresnes, in Hauts-de-Seine. Among the options, is the mobilization of public land and the acceleration of the transformation of vacant offices. An inter-ministerial delegate will be appointed by the end of the year to manage the plan.

A 15-year-old teenager is suspected of having killed his parents in Châteautilain last weekend in Isère. The police are actively searching for him. The victims were found with fire shot wounds, in a burned house. The teenager suffers from Lyme disease and no longer attends school.

And to finish: You will have difficulty getting your meals delivered via Uber Eats or Deliveroo this weekend. The delivery people of these platforms are called to strike. The unions are denouncing a reduction in the remuneration of their rates. Tomorrow around ten demonstrations and gatherings are planned in France.
