Emmanuel Macron calls on the G7 countries to put an end to coal before 2030. The Head of State said this this afternoon at the COP28 forum in Dubai. Continuing investments in favor of coal is “a real absurdity” according to the French president.

France considers that a resumption of the truce in Gaza is “essential”. Fighting has resumed, as the Israeli army accuses the Hamas of having fired rockets into its territory. The leader of the Human Rights Council considers this resumption of hostilities “catastrophic”.

Elisabeth Borne triggers a new 49.3 article of the constitution to definitively adopt the Social Security budget. This is the 20th time she has used this article since her appointment at Matignon.

And the MP of the Insoumis Ugo Bernalicis is deprived of 25% of his compensation, as a consequence of his fit of anger before the law committee last night, as the MPs continued the examination of the immigration bill. It was the President of the National Assembly Yaël Braun-Pivet who pronounced the sanction.

Two weeks after the death of Thomas in Crépol, several demonstrations planned in Drome and Nice were banned. The prefectures fear the risk of violence as these demonstrations have links with ultra-right networks. The investigation into the teenager's death continues. Nine people, including three minors, have been indicted in for “organized gang murder”.

World AIDS Day is today. According to the annual report from Santé Public France, last year, the number of screenings exceeded its pre-Covid levels. Furthermore, prejudices about the illness and discrimination are disturbingly progressing according to an Ifop survey. The indicators recorded are the worst since the survey was created in 2009.

And then Rafael Nadal makes his return. After almost a year of absence due to injuries, the 37-year-old Spanish tennis player will compete again at the start of next season. He will be in Brisbane the first week of January. The tournament will be an opportunity for him to prepare before the Australian Open.
