The alleged assailant of Saturday's knife attack in Paris began to speak during his police custody. The 26-year-old Franco-Iranian, "fiché S" and radicalized who has caused one death and two injuries, suffers from a psychiatric disorder and had stopped his treatment at the request of certain doctors. "There was clearly a psychiatric failure", says the Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin on BFM TV.

Furthermore, the German federal prosecutor's office has opened an investigation into the attack in Paris, the victim being a German-Filipino tourist.

In the rest of the news, Éric Dupond-Moretti is definitively acquitted. The public prosecutor's office announced this morning that it will not appeal the decision of the court. The Minister of Justice was suspected of illegal conflict of interest. The Keeper of the Seals was therefore released and will be able to keep his position at the Ministry of Justice.

7 years ago, to the day after the disappearance of Narumi in Besançon, the case is before the courts. Nicolas Zepeda's appeal trial opens today before the Vesoul Court of Appeal. The 32-year-old Chilean is accused of having murdered his Japanese ex-girlfriend on the night of December 4 to the 5, 2016. Her body was never found. At first instance he was sentenced to 28 years in prison. This appeal trial is expected to last 3 weeks.

The Minister of Health Aurélien Rousseau is expected at the Remiremont hospital in the Vosges today. An establishment in which several people have died under suspicious circumstances. 12 complaints have been filed since last year by families having lost a loved one.

And then Beyonce is at the top of the American box office. Her "Renaissance" film generated 21 million dollars in revenue for its first weekend of release. The film is directed and produced by the artist herself and retraces her big world tour, from Stockholm to Kansas City. The film has been available in theaters in France since Wednesday.
