The private hire car driver who is accused of stabbing an FC Nantes supporter, has been charged with “intentional homicide”. The 35-year-old driver allegedly stabbed the fan twice just before Saturday evening’s match between Nantes and OGC Nice. Another driver was charged with intentional violence and tampering with evidence.

Police custody continues today for the alleged assailant of the attack in Paris, which left one dead and two injured on Saturday evening. When questioned yesterday, the 26-year-old French Iranian suspect claimed that he had acted in retaliation to the persecution of Muslims around the world. He was known to be radicalised and suffering from a psychiatric disorder.

Vapes will be banned in middle and high schools by the start of the 2024 school year. Yesterday the Assemblée Nationale voted unanimously on the ban. The bill will now go to the Senate and the European Commission.

The social security budget was also adopted yesterday, which will include changes to sick leave and the possibility for menstrual cups and panties to be reimbursed for women under 26.

And finally to women’s football and today the French team will be playing Portugal in the Nations League. Les Bleus are already guaranteed to finish top of their group and have qualified for the Final Four. The match gets underway at 7:15.
