Gérald Darmanin spoke before the National Assembly this afternoon on the immigration bill. The Minister of the Interior called on MPs to not refuse the debate on immigration, as the opposition threatened to vote on a motion to reject. During his speech, Gérald Darmanin reached out to the MPs, ensuring that the text was definitive.

Gabriel Attal is the guest this evening on the 8 p.m. news of TF1. The Minister of Education will reveal the outlines of the experiment on school uniforms. Several cities are testing the measure, including Nice, Metz and even Reims.

From an Airbus site in Toulouse, Emmanuel Macron takes stock of the France 2030 investment and innovation plan. A plan launched 2 years ago and of which half of the 54 billion euros in credits have already been committed. The Head of State said this afternoon that this money has so far benefited 3,000 projects carried out by 3,500 companies, in particular SMEs and research centers.
