Will an agreement be found on the immigration bill? After having received them for the first time today, Elisabeth Borne will meet once again with the *Republicain* executives tomorrow morning, in Matignon. The objective is to find a compromise on the controversial text. As for the joint commission, it will meet on Monday. In the event of failure of negotiations, the bill will be abandoned.

A schoolgirl was arrested in Rennes after brandishing a knife in class this morning. The teenager, in *cinquième*, was targeting her English teacher. She is said to have made a reference to the Arras attack - the murder of the teacher Dominique Bernard in October. According to the first elements, the young girl was angry with the teacher, who had confiscated her cell phone. No one was injured. Classes were interrupted and a psychological support unit will be set up. A criminal investigation, entrusted to departmental security, has been opened.

"The Dubai agreement is an important step", said Emmanuel Macron at the end of the COP28. Nearly 200 countries agree for the first time on transitioning away from fossil fuels to fight global warming. The objective is to achieve carbon neutrality by 2050. According to UN Secretary General Antonio Guterres, "the era of fossil fuels must end with justice and equity".

The 100-euro bonus to encourage carpooling will be renewed next year, but only for short trips, less than 80 kilometers. This bonus has made it possible to double the number of daily carpools in a year, going from 25,000 to 50,000, all platforms combined.

And then there are only seven departments under orange alert for floods. In the West, the alert goes from Deux-Sèvres to Gironde, via Corrèze. In the East, only Isère is concerned. Météo France warns of possible difficulties in traffic and calls for caution.
