Elisabeth Borne and the Republicain executives continue to negotiate on the subject of the immigration bill. The Prime Minister is still trying to find a compromise on the controversial text. As for the Minister of the Interior Gérald Darmanin, he hopes to have a final version of the bill by the beginning of next week. Discussions will be held from Monday within the framework of a joint committee.

The teenager who threatened her English teacher yesterday in Rennes has been hospitalized. According to her psychiatric examination, she is considered a "danger to herself". The 12-year-old girl is already known for her disorderly behavior. Last June she was expelled from another middle school in Rennes for threats and insults towards a teacher.

Today is the last day of hearing for Monique Olivier before the court of Hauts-de-Seine. The exwife of Michel Fourniret is on trial for the kidnappings and murders committed by her husband, including the disappearance of Estelle Mouzin. Monique Olivier has so far not given details on how the events unfolded.

After the taxis, it is the turn of the VTC drivers to go on strike. Many go-slow operations are planned today in Paris, Lille and Nice, where big traffic jams were observed between the port and the airport. They demonstrate against the Uber platform and denounce their working conditions and their drop in income.

Today begins a two-day European Council in Brussels, with at the heart of discussions: Ukraine, and the opening of negotiations for its accession to the European Union. A scenario in which the Prime Minister opposes Hungarian Minister Viktor Orban and without his agreement, it is impossible to foresee Ukrainian accession. The green light from Hungary is also essential to release a new aid of 50 billion euros.
