New demonstrations against the immigration law are taking place today throughout France. This morning around fifty students blocked the largest building of the University of Strasbourg. The general secretary of the CGT Sophie Binet calls for civil disobedience. According to the union, the text "deeply calls into question all our republican principles".

This immigration law is also not well received in the Reunion island either. Several municipalities, including Saint-Denis, have put their flag at half-mast. According to Huguette Bello, the president of the Region, the text contains provisions seriously undermining the principle of Equality and the fundamental values of the Republic.

The time has come for deliberations at the Court of Appeal of Haute-Saône, where the verdict at the trial of Nicolas Zepeda will soon be communicated. This Chilean is on trial for the murder of Narumi in Besançon - The Japanese student who has been missing for 7 years. And for his last speech before the Court this morning, he reaffirmed his innocence. At first instance 1 and a half years ago, Nicolas Zepeda was sentenced to 28 years in prison. Yesterday the attorney general requested life in prison.

A teacher is hospitalized in Yvelines, after ingesting a drink in which a student put a detergent product. Examinations are underway, but her life is not at risk. A disciplinary council for the teenager will take place when classes resume in January.

And after several postponements, the UN Security Council will try again today to reach an agreement on humanitarian aid in the Gaza Strip. On site, Israel ordered the evacuation of a vast area in the town of Khan Younes, the largest in the south of the Gaza Strip, where many Palestinians displaced by the conflict have taken refuge.
