A quintuple homicide and a crime scene of great violence. The public prosecutor of Meaux provided an update on the discovery of the lifeless bodies of a mother and her 4 children aged 9 months to 10 years old. They were found in their apartment last night. The father of the children was arrested this morning in Sevran in Seine Saint Denis. He was placed in police custody and hospitalized under close surveillance. An investigation into intentional homicide was opened.

A "new Islamophobic act marked by cowardice", is what the cultural association of Muslims of Vigneux-sur-Seine denounces after the discovery of the corpse of a wild boar hanging on the gate of the town's mosque. The faithful of this town in Essonne made the discovery on Sunday morning. A complaint was filed and an investigation opened.

He was a figure of the conservative right. Patrick Buisson died at the age of 74. Essayist and writer, he was also Nicolas Sarkozy's advisor during his time at the Elysée. On X, Marine Lepen praised "a mad lover of France". Republican President Eric Ciotti paid tribute to a man "who saw, before many, the great dangers that threaten our country."

And the French video game giant was the victim of a cyberattack. The publisher Ubisoft was reportedly targeted by hackers. The company's spokesperson acknowledged a data security incident and an internal investigation has been opened.

Also in the news: No truce in the Middle East for the holiday period. The Israeli army continues its operations and bombings in the Gaza Strip. Benjamin Netanyahu visited the site alongside IDF soldiers. He promised that the war against Hamas will be long and that the fighting will intensify in the days to come.
