The investigation continues into the five murders in Meaux, where the body of a mother and those of her four children were found in an apartment on Monday evening. The father, who is the main suspect, was arrested yesterday and admitted to hospital as he has been receiving treatment for depression and psychotic disorders since 2017. Now, the authorities will have to determine whether there was any alteration to his decision-making capabilities.

142 previously confiscated drones will be put to use during the Paris Olympics. The drones in question were all confiscated due to flying illegally over the capital. As the drones have since been lying around unused, the Ministry of Justice has decided to donate them to Paris police headquarters so that the Directorate for Public Order and Traffic can deploy them for surveillance and security purposes during this summer's major sporting event.

At least six people have been killed and several others injured in the West Bank after Israeli bombing hit a Palestinian camp located in the north of the country. The Palestinian Ministry of Health said the bombing had taken place and that more than 240 Palestinians have died in the last 24 hours.

And finally to sport, as is the annual tradition, newspaper L'Equipe has revealed its pick of the Champions of Champions. French sportspeople who have been honoured include golfer Céline Boutier, the first French woman to win a Major in twenty years and swimmer Léon Marchand who bagged three gold medals and a world record in Japan last summer. Representing disabled sports, paracyclists Alexandre Leauté and Heidi Gaugain have been honoured.
