The father is being heard this morning after the death of his wife and his 4 children, aged from 9 months to 10 years old. Their bodies were discovered in an apartment in Meaux, in Seine et Marne, Monday evening. The custody of the 33-year-old main suspect has been extended. He has been monitored for depressive and psychotic disorders since 2017.

An investigation has been opened in Pas de Calais after the discovery last night of 26 migrants in a stolen van on the A16 motorway. They were arrested and the vehicle was seized. As for the driver, he managed to escape.

The State will do its utmost to help rebuild Sportica. This was announced by the Minister of Sports Amélie Oudéa Castéra, after the fire which ravaged the sports center on Monday.
