The father accused of having killed his wife and four children Monday evening in Meaux will be brought before an investigating judge. The suspect admitted and explained that he heard voices asking him to do harm. Since 2017, he has been monitored for depressive and psychotic disorders. A judicial investigation for "intentional homicide by a spouse" and "intentional homicide of minors under 15 years old" is open.

A young 19-year-old woman suffering from deafness disappeared in the Drôme. She has not given any sign of life since yesterday morning, in the area of Cré. Having recently arrived in France, the young woman had been living with a foster family for a month.

What future for Habitat? Less than a month after its placement in receivership, the furniture brand should be liquidated today by the court of Bobigny, due to its serious financial difficulties. Habitat has 25 stores in France and employs 315 employees. Last year the brand generated a turnover of 65 million euros.

A hard blow for the oyster farmers of the Arcachon basin, during this holiday period: Their oysters are prohibited for sale after poisoning - Poisoning which is not considered serious, but which causes the symptoms of a gastroenteritis, specifies the prefecture of Gironde. The ban on sale is pronounced until further notice and for those who have not yet consumed them, they are asked to return them to the point of sale.

And to finish: from today, French schoolchildren who go on trips to London can cross the border without a passport as part of a school trip. A simple identity card is enough, as was the case before the Brexit. Last March, British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak committed to Emmanuel Macron to facilitate travel for school groups to the United Kingdom.
